Stallions, mares and geldings five years old or over

A pony shall not be eligible to compete if it:-

- i) has qualified before 1st January of the current year for the Mountain and Moorland Ridden Championship Final at The Horse of the Year Show
- or ii) has qualified before 1st January of the current year for the NPS/Baileys Horse Feeds Mountain and Moorland Supreme Ridden Championship Final at Olympia.

14. Novice Pony in its first season under saddle **Snaffle bridles only. (stallions excluded)**
15. Novice Pony Not to have won 2 firsts in ridden classes. **Any suitable bit. (stallions excluded)**
16. Traditional Ridden. **Walk and Trot only**
17. Open Ridden Class
18. Veteran Pony under saddle. Pony to be 16 years and over.

- or ii) has qualified before 1st January of the current year for the NPS/Baileys Horse Feeds Mountain and Moorland Supreme Ridden Championship Final at Olympia.

RULES

Exhibitors MUST be current fully paid up Members of either or both of the Fell Pony Society or Dales Pony Society. Please note that in the case of Dales Pony Classes; the Pony Handler must also be a fully paid up Member of the Dales Pony Society.

Any person riding within the show premises must wear a riding hat conforming to current BSI hat safety standards. Hard hats to be worn by all competitors in Young Handler classes 10 and 35.

Ponies must be registered with either the Fell Pony Society or the Dales Pony Society.

The current showing rules of each Breed Society apply to the appropriate classes. Please contact the Breed Society concerned if you need a copy.

A Points Trophy will be awarded to the Fell or Dales Pony gaining the most points on the day. Points awarded for places 1st to 6th in all classes

Stallion owners and exhibitors, please note that stallions at all times must be handled or ridden at the show by a person 16 years or over (on 1st January 2008). This show actively encourages novice pony entries in all disciplines and as such stallions must be closely and actively observed whilst on the show field.

Should entries be large, classes will be split.

NPS MOUNTAIN AND MOORLAND QUALIFYING ROUNDS

These classes are judged under the Rules of the NPS. Ponies must be registered in the main body of their respective Mountain & Moorland Stud Books. Part bred are not eligible. Ponies to be trimmed only within their Breed Society specification. Manes must not be plaited and tails must not be braided. All ponies in Novice Classes must be shown in one of the snaffle bits illustrated in the NPS Official List of Judges and Rules.

Qualifying rounds are open to both NPS Members and Non Members but only the highest placed NPS Adult member, on production of their membership card in the ring, will be eligible to qualify for the Final. A valid Membership Card must be in the Rider's/Handler's possession on entering the ring.

The first prize winners from each class will go forward to the Final to be held at the NPS Summer Championship Show, Malvern, in August. A pony may only qualify once. Where the first pony in the class has already qualified, the pony standing next in line which has not qualified will be deemed the qualifier. Qualification may go no lower than third place.

NPS Adult/Standard members will be required to upgrade to Adult/Showing to enter the Final. Qualified Ponies must be entered into the NPS Competition Final within 14 days for the pony to be eligible to appear in the Final.

COURT FARM QUALIFIER

This show is a qualifier for the Court Farm Ridden Dales Pony of the Year Championship held at the Dales Performance Show on Sunday 31st August 2008

COMPLAINTS

This show has been organised to encourage entries from novice and experienced competitors alike. We want this to be an enjoyable show. With that in mind, we hope exhibitors will come and have a nice day with their ponies. If you really must complain, your complaint must be accompanied by a fee of £40.00, which will only be returned if the complaint is upheld.

From the North, leave the M6 at Junction 40, go south, taking signs for A66, at next roundabout take 4th Exit to Clifton (A6). Drive through Eamont Bridge, past Lowther Caravan Park on right, and take 2nd left turn, field is on the right.

If travelling from the East on A66, at first Penrith roundabout take 1st exit which will then take you through Eamont Bridge as above.

Fell Pony Society Trotting Events Rules

1. Have fun.
2. All ponies **MUST** be registered with The Fell Pony Society.
3. All competitors must have a saddle and bridle (any suitable), there will be no traditional bareback race, on account of stipulations of the public liability insurance. Whips must not exceed 30 inches.
4. All races will be approximately 1 mile.
5. If a pony breaks into canter you must circle immediately, failure to do so will result in disqualification.
6. All ponies entered at their owner's risk.
7. Hard hats to current safety standards must be worn at all times whilst mounted and suitable footwear with a heel. No spurs.
8. No stallions must race.
9. On the grounds of safety runners in each race will be limited to 8 – heats may be run with a final.
10. The general rules of our host show **MUST** be adhered to at all time.
11. The decision of The Fell Pony Society Trotting Event Committee is final.
12. It is advised that all ponies are covered for public liability insurance before racing.
13. A handicap system will be run throughout the year, whereby winning ponies will start a distance behind the main field in subsequent races.
