

RING 2 **RIDDEN CLASSES** Starting 11.00 am

Class 11 Lead Rein Class. Mare or gelding of 4 years old or over to be ridden by a child 9 years old or under and to be led by an adult.

Class 12 First Ridden Class. Mare or gelding of 4 years old or over to be ridden by a child up to 14 years old. Walk and trot only. Riders may canter in their individual show if they wish.

Class 13 Ridden Class for Mares 4 years or over.

Class 14 Ridden Class for Geldings 4 years or over.

Class 15 Ridden Class for Novice Ponies. Mare or Gelding not to have won a 1st prize at any show affiliated to the FPS, NPS or Ponies Association (UK). Snaffle Bridles only.

This show is a qualifier for the NCPA Pony of the Year Show to be held at Manor Farm, Knutsford, Cheshire in September 2009. NCPA Affiliation no 166/09.
First and Second prizewinners in classes 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,10,13 14 and 15 will qualify.
An NCPA Star Rosette will be awarded in Classes 8 and 14. Exhibitors must enter the ring wearing their NCPA badge and present their current year's NCPA Membership Card.

SHOW RULES: PLEASE READ THE FOLLOWING:

- 1 The Fell Pony Society will not be responsible for any accidents which may occur on the show field. Entries are accepted subject to this condition. Exhibitors are advised that all ponies should be insured for public liability.
- 2 This show is held under the Rules found in the FPS Handbook for Showing and Competing. Hard hats to current BS standard, correctly secured, must be worn at all times when riders are mounted and within the show field. Ponies tack and riders dress must conform to FPS Ridden showing rules.
- 3 Only paid up current Fell Pony Society members are eligible to enter. Membership Subscriptions for 2009 must therefore have been paid.
- 4 Entries: £3 per entry, or £6 per entry taken on the field, for all classes. For Class 18, entry fee is £3 per rider. Entry forms to be completed and forwarded with entry fees (cheques payable to The Fell Pony Society) to Fell Pony Society Office, Ion House, Great Asby, Appleby, Cumbria CA16 6HD. Telephone 017683 53100
Closing Date for Entries 30th May 2009. No entries for the catalogue will be accepted after this date. Late entries on the field only.
- 5 For all classes, rosettes will be awarded to 6th place with cash prizes of £5, £3, £2 and £1 for the first four places. Rosettes and prize money for each rider in Class 18.

Special Rosettes for the Supreme Champion Pony and the Reserve Ridden Champion Pony are donated by the Williamson family.
- 6 Exhibitors are asked not to enter classes judged by their pony's breeder. A judge may not judge a pony which holds his/her prefix or which has been bred by his/her immediate family. If the judge finds that, inadvertently, such a situation should arise, he/she should ask the steward to call the referee judge into the ring to place the pony in question.
- 7 Any objection or complaint must be made in writing in accordance with the Complaints and Disciplinary Procedure.

RING 1 IN HAND CLASSES Starting at 9.30am

- Class 1** Mare 4 years old or over with no foal at foot.
- Class 2** Gelding 4 years or over.
- Class 3** Veteran Mare or Gelding 15 years or over not to be shown in any other in hand class.
- Class 4** Brood Mare 4 years or over with foal at foot.
- Class 5** Foal.
- Class 6** Yearling colt, filly or gelding.
- Class 7** Two year old filly or gelding.
- Class 8** Three year old filly or gelding.

In Hand Championship

- Class 9** Young Judges Class. Open to boys or girls not to have achieved their 18th birthday by 1st January in the current year.

This class is to encourage young members to appreciate the show points of Fell Ponies. Competitors will be asked to place ponies, with reasons given, and to have a short chat with the Judge. All entrants will be expected to be smartly dressed and to conduct themselves well when in the ring. Hard hats must be worn. Marks will be awarded on:

- a) Placing of Ponies.
- b) Personal Smartness.
- c) Ring Manners.

- Class 10** Young Handlers Class. Mare or gelding of 4 years old or over to be shown in hand by boy or girl not to have achieved their 18th birthday by 1st January in the current year.

Handling and Presentation of pony only to be judged. Hard hats must be worn. Numbers permitting, this class may be divided into two – up to 12 years old and 13 years and over.

A Fell Pony Breeders Association Gold Shield Rosette to be presented to the highest placed handler in the class who is handling a pony owned by a member of the FPBA and who has not won this award in a previous show in 2009.
