that had a compulsory canter with a little jump at the end of the section. I was determined Thomas could do this; I knew this and he knew this but he took some persuading. Eventually he went, - trot, fast trot and then BINGO we had canter. I was looking at the jump but Thomas had his sights set on something else - the judge. At first I didn't realise, I mean the judge was standing quite close to the jump and it was only as we got nearer that a sickly feeling came over me as I began to understand what was about to happen. "Get out of the way", I yelled. When I opened my eyes I thought we'd made it. It was only when I looked back and saw the judge climbing out of the bushes that I realised we wouldn't have missed if he hadn't moved! We didn't get placed that day, but as nobody actually got hurt, I didn't really care.

As the time moved on Thomas I began to understand eachother and I found I could read his movements quite well. Although we had a fight every time I rode him, and I ate a lot of dirt while examining forest tracks, Thomas had another side to him. He loved children and novice riders. He would do anything for them, in fact when he had a child or novice on board he was a different animal; he was responsible, mature and most confusingly, he was very, very KIND. Because of Thomas' love of people he became a prime candidate for the Fell Pony tent. His claim to fame is that he spent a weekend in the tent at Lowther and he loved every minute of it - all those people fussing and feeding him - it was like being in heaven for Thomas.

Thomas and I spent many hours roaming the Lakeland Fells. He was quite happy to wander up and down fell tracks and looking back, I think that's when we were both happiest.

I gave up showing in the mid-eighties as no matter what I did, I couldn't win with Thomas. Other riders, however, had totally different success records with him. I moved over to horses and started to compete with them, which left Thomas at a bit of a loose end. I was surprised to find myself overrun with people begging and pleading to borrow Thomas for riding schools, private homes, children and other activities. He was loaned out to three different riding schools and was popular. Eventually he went to a private home on loan and again was a rip-roaring success.

It was at his last loan that he took ill and, after a short period, died at his home in November 1996. Thomas was my best friend and I will always think of him as my family. He is greatly missed but I amhappy to have shared in his life. He taught me a great lesson in life and that is... You can take a Thomas to water but you can't make him drink!!


THE ONE THAT GOT AWAY



For years I've slipped & slithered atop my Fell pony. No saddle we ever tried could minimise the rolling from side to side and either they were not wide enough for him or just too uncomfortable for me. Her extensive knowledge of and interest in country affairs and equine matters is reflected in the vibrant detail of her scultures. This is no more apparent than in the Limited Edition Anne Butler Fell Pony Stallion which was so successfully launched at the Fell Pony Breed Show last year. Plans for a matching Mare and Foal figurine have unfortunately had to be put on hold due to Anne's recent accident. She can only offer her apologies for any delay and will deal with enquiries on a first come - first served basis.

Anne's versatility, whether in portraiture or animal sculpture, is acknowledged world-wide. A particular feature of Anne's art is the ability, with any edition, to paint each sculpture uniquely, often from a client's own photographs or instructions.

Artistically Anne was a late developer, returning to school as a mature student followed by art college paved the way to a new career. 1994 proved to the the turning point. The bold decision to pursue an independent career opened up a refreshing new lifestyle. Anne has been able to paint and sculpt subjects of her own choosing.

Anne researches her subject with meticulous care. The original is hand carved using dental tools in plastaline wax. Next a hard master copy is produced from a mould and this is then carefully scrutinised. Whatever final medium - porcelain, bronze, silver - is used, the basic steps are the same. The edition is limited in number before production starts, is cast and finished entirely by hand. Commissions and exclusive trophies are an increasingly important area of her work.

Capital investment in state-of-the-art packaging machinery ensures safe and prompt delivery anywhere in the world. Anne Butler sculptures are proudly owned by collectors in some 23 countries.

Anne travels a great deal to keep abreast of current trends and to further her research. Her next overseas venue will be at the International Arab Horse Assocation National Show in Lexington, Kentucky from 16th to 25th October.
