

Thirty years since man walked on the moon and thirty years since Eden View Moonstroller's birth, all on 21st July 1999 - surely a reason to celebrate? - and celebrate we did! Party time produced his first guest in the morning, when Moonstroller met his grandson for the first time. Driving pony Admergill Alexander had traveled from Hertfordshire to be with him and the moment of meeting was recorded on the Radio. After lunch tandem, pair and single turnouts met for sherry on the village green with ridden event horse, his stable companion, a race-horse, ridden veteran rival Bowderdale Jess, driving class rival Foggy Gill Jack Flash and leading rein ponies. TV cameras recorded the Birthday Boy's arrival on the green and the departure of the guests for a 12 mile ride/drive - a Cumbrian experience for visitors from Derbyshire, Leicester and Scotland joining those more local. On returning 100 human guests took tea before assembling in the stable yard for the cake cutting - iced as it was in the colours strollers carriage, colours carried to victory on the racecourse three times this year, and the colours of the commemorative rosettes worn by the equine guests. With Champagne they toasted his birthday - so many people whom Stroller's life has touched over the years and so many happy memories of a very special day.

Princess arrived with us in September 1999, she was my first Fell Pony. Throughout her time with us she always impressed all who met her with her generous character and sometimes rather evil sense of humour, always patient and gentle with the weak and nervous, she would never suffer fools.

This was very evident when she was the mainstay of our Riding School. Many learned to ride on her, gaining confidence and skill, however, she was very adept at giving people "flying lessons" if they were slow at grasping the idea of gentle hands and light seats - especially when jumping, even though they would be let down gently to earth!

Princess was an excellent driving pony, she was used for RDA work, and on occasion would happily work in our nearby forest bringing home winter fuel. She bred several nice foals then went up to Perthshire to teach my sister in law to ride. Three years ago she returned South of the Border and went to live with the Skelton family at Greengill Farm Gilcrux where she ended her days, at the Skeltons request she was buried on the farm.

She leaves many happy memories behind her and will always be remembered for her patient, unflappable temperament, and an amazing understanding of the people she came into contact with.

SHILSTONE ROCKS BLACKBERRY 1966-1998

Shilstone Rocks Blackberry was an outstanding Fell Pony in every sense of the word and her death on August 12th 1998 saddened all those who knew her. Blackberry arrived in Wymeswold as a foal, almost by accident since she was spotted in the back of a dark barn when trying to help a friend buy a Connemara.

She had an outstanding show career from an early age, taking all before her, both in-hand and ridden, and in fact she was so successful that she was retired from the show circuit at the age of 6. Her showing was not just the serious stuff; as a yearling she had painted hooves and eye make-up to become the "fashion conscious pony" in a very large group fancy dress put on by Wolds Stud at the Ponies of Britain show (now Ponies UK) at Peterborough, as the "Not to be forgotten Ponies of Britain".

She had her first foal Wolds Jackdaw and then returned to work carrying out all sorts of tasks, excelling particularly in the hunting field where she hunted with the Quorn and the Surrey Union. Blackberry was always at the front of the field, and was a tremendous pony to hunt, having excellent manners and tremendous stamina and speed. she was ridden and hunted by adults and children alike.

Returning to stud Blackberry had a foal by the Riding Pony Stallion Mr Chips and we showed both mare and foal in riding pony classes where a lot of smart people were astounded at being beaten by a Fell Pony!

Wolds Black Chip (the foal) was also very successful in the Show ring. All of Black-berry's children achieved great success with Wolds Oriole being the most notable, qualifying for Olympia in the early days. At 15 years of age Blackberry returned to the show ring as a veteran and showed everybody how it should be done, taking ridden and in-hand championships. Blackberry was above all else a pony of tremendous character, who else would escape from a field and bring her friends three miles to her home in Wymeswold in the middle of the night. It was rather a suprise to find three ponies asking to be let into the yard when they should be in the next village! In the show ring she could be an angel or do the most spectacular elephant act, even as a veteran! Her ears were amazing as she could bury them completely if the horse next to her was the wrong colour or breed, although she adored Shetlands, presumably thinking they were foals.

She ended her days in the lap of luxury with a friend who attended her every need. There will never be another Blackberry, she left a deep impression on all who dealt with her, and we will greatly miss her.

LAKELAND'S TRAIL RIDER GUIDE BOOKS

A new and very interesting Lakeland's Trail Rider Guide Book to "The High Street Ride" was received at the Office, Chris Clark provides some background information on her involvement with Fell Ponies and how she came to write her guide books.

Chris writes:

I suppose my addiction for riding the high fells of Cumbria began at the same time as my introduction to the Fell Pony. This was during the 60's when I

worked as a pony trekking instructor at the Tarn Hows Hotel, near Hawkshead. The Centre had a mixed bag of horses and ponies, and amongst these was a little black Fell mare named Mona. Mona was 32 years old, as fit as a fiddle and as artful as a box of monkeys. She knew all the dodges and shortcuts there was to know about the trekking game and she certainly taught me a thing or two.

It definitely was not love at first sight, and my first few weeks riding her as a lead horse were traumatic to say the least. She would do nothing I asked her to without a fight, and trying to open gates whilst mounted gave the riders behind me endless hours of entertainment. She knew exactly when I had leaned over just that little bit too much and she always picked this precise moment to slyly shuffle away, which placed that elusive catch once more just a fraction out of reach. In fact she was an absolute cow!

The one memorable day, she grew tired of playing games and turned into a superb lead horse, who showed me that without any indication from me, position herself in precisely the right place for every gate on every ride. From then onwards I have been one of the Fell ponies biggest fan.

Anyway that is a long time ago, and although I haven't exactly "gone on to do great things" I have enjoyed my continued association with the breed, combined with the varied terrain that the bridleways of Cumbria have to offer.

For the last 7 years I have had the pleasure of owning and riding a lovely Fell mare registered as Sleddale Beauty XXVII, called Bramble by me on good days and many other unladylike names on the bad days. Bramble was honoured during the early 90's by winning the tile of Supreme Champion at the Southern Fell Pony Show. Although this was quite an accolade, I have discovered that I get more pleasure riding on the open fell that I do from the showring, and so that is what I have been doing. During this time Bramble and I have formed a partnership which is in itself a unique and fulfilling experience, one I can highly recommends.

Over the years I have ridden many routes some following ancient Packhorse and Drover routes forged by our ancestors during a different era. I have traveled along Roman roads, Corps roads, Monks roads, Trades routes and Smugglers routes to name but a few. I have enjoyed them all and thrived on the beauty mother nature has bestowed

on Cumbria, whilst at the same time gaining useful knowledge from the experiences and challenges she has placed before me.

Lakeland's Trail Rider Guide Books are simply a documentation of some of the rides I have enjoyed. They have been written for those who wish to get more from their chosen leisure activity than a short 'Hack Out' they offer the rider spectacular scenery, the odd challenge and the feeling of having achieved something. The routes wind their way over the open fells and meander through tranquil traffic free valleys. there are forests, lakes, streams and high level ridge rides that will undoubtedly charm and perhaps even challenge you as you traverse their lengths. They are worlds away from modern day living and they are waiting there for you to explore and enjoy. But be warned it may become an addiction!

The books contain daily route maps and clear directions. Daily mileage and high point reached each day. Accommodation details for you and your horse. Details of the equipment you will need to take with you. Helpful hints will help you make the most of your holiday. Details of local Vets and Farriers and advice on some hazards you may encounter en route. I have included information I think you might find helpful when it comes to riding the trail. All the rider has to do is pick up the phone, book the accommodation, and get themselves and their mounts fit enough to cope with the journey

Go for it!!


