RULES

1. The Fell Pony Society does not accept liability for any loss of property or any accident or damage to any animal, vehicles, spectator or exhibitor, and all the entries are accepted subject to this condition.
2. All ponies must be registered with the Fell Pony Society.
3. All ponies must be the bona fide property of a fully paid full or junior (but not associate) member of the Fell Pony Society. **Each pony's owner's FPS membership number MUST be on the entry form.**
4. Exhibitors should not enter classes judged by their pony's breeder or the breeder's family.
5. Ponies may only be entered once in any class (except for the handy pony – class 26). In class 26 each *pony and rider/handler combination* may only enter each section (in-hand and ridden) once.
6. **Entries on the day will only be accepted for ponies which have been pre-entered at least one class.**
7. Entries on the day per rule 6 charged at £8 per entry (per pair for classes 12 & 19).
8. Ponies must be vaccinated against equine flu.
9. Ponies must not exceed 14hh. Judges may ask for entries to be measured. JMB certificates accepted.
11. All cups and trophies are perpetual – if you won one at the 2025 show please remember to bring it back.
12. Riders must wear a riding hat that complies with the current safety standard.
13. Complaints must be made in writing within 30 minutes of the incident occurring to the Show Secretary with a fee of £25 (fee will be refunded if complaint is upheld).
14. The judge's decision is final.

Pony must be 4 years old or over, and a mare or gelding

Pony to be shown in hand – may be accompanied by an adult in case of emergencies

21. CHILDREN Lead Rein^{2*}

Pony to be ridden by a child aged 10 yrs and under and led by an adult

The **Wasdale Fell Ponies Trophy** presented by Mr and Mrs Warnecke

22. CHILDREN 6 – 12 years^{2*}

Pony to be ridden by a child aged 6 – 12 years

The **Sleddale Rosemary Trophy** presented by the Norris Family

²Riders may only enter class 21 or 22, not both

23. CHILDREN 13 – 16 years*

Pony to be ridden by a child aged 13 - 16 years

The **Brambleleigh Cup** presented by Mrs EM Knowles

24. FAMILY PONY*

One pony, two riders, whose ages are at least 10 years apart

One rider to jump a small course (max height 18”), the other to give a ridden show (children may be led)

The **Present and Future Trophy** presented by Miss J Glass & Dr E Whitley

Special rosette for the best adult and child pair

25. FANCY DRESS*

The **Cook Cup** presented by Miss S Cook

26. HANDY PONY/ HORSE AGILITY* (see rule 5)

Section A – ridden (children may be led by an adult)

Section B – in hand (ponies must be 3 years and over)

Section C – disabled rider (may omit 2 obstacles)

The **Mooti Moo Trophy** presented by Mr & Mrs L Rowe for ridden

The **Wolds Golden Plover Trophy** presented by Mrs H Taylor for the in-hand.

Dressage classes are open to all registered native breeds. Rosettes will be awarded in sections, but NPS qualification is across both Fell and non-Fell sections.

NPS Dressage Qualifiers

Classes 32 and 33 are qualifiers for the NPS Supreme Dressage Championships 2027. The TWO highest placed ponies and riders in each of the following categories scoring at least 59% will qualify

- (a) Pony not exceeding 138cm
- (b) Pony 138cm or over
- (c) Rider 12yrs and under on 01.01.2026
- (d) Rider 18yrs and under on 01.01.2026

Horse/ponies must be ridden at the Final by the qualifying rider. The owner or rider must be fully paid up Dressage, Qualifying or Life members of the NPS for 2027 in order to compete at the Final (but you **do not** need to be an NPS member in order to qualify at this show).

FPS Breeders' Trophy

In memory of Chris Thompson and donated by the Thompson family. All In Hand exhibits at the FPS Stallion & Colt Show, the FPS Breed Show and FPS Southern Show are automatically entered for the Breeders' Trophy. They do not need a special entry form. The award is calculated on a points basis and is presented at the AGM to the Fell pony breeder whose prefix accumulates the highest total. If you do not wish to be included in the award then please advise the FPS office by 30 September.

The Groovy Hooves Trophy

for ponies taking part in dressage (classes 31, 32 & 33), working hunter pony/Family Pony (classes 24, 27, 28, 29) **and** handy pony (class 26). To be eligible a pony must take part in at least **one class** in **each of the three categories**. The winner is the pony with the highest number of points from three classes, one in each category. Groovy rosettes to 6th place.
